The policy is defining when we use a student's legal name verses chosen name Comments: Dustin wants to know what the wording "advising tools" means in the document? Suggestion to take advising tools out. Diplomas: Beth share she has always had an issues with diploma being in any name. Chris Sweet shared that we are legally required to allow the student to select their preferred name by House or Senate Bill for the State of Oregon that passed a few years ago. This is not the same for Transcripts which is the "official record". A change was made to the procedures section to read Colleague, Moodle, My Clackamas, Self Service, Navigate and other systems. With these edits are we ready to present to college council. Chris Sweet moved to approve to college council for a 1st review. Jim Martineau 2nd the motion Committee approved to move Policy and procedure forward to College Council for first review. CCC Information &	Review of feedback from ARC DEI Training and Information Needs Assessment survey.	
DEI Training & Needs Assessment – Survey Results	 Review of feedback from ARC DET fraining and information Needs Assessment survey. This survey built on previous conversations about our existing and future DEI training needs. The survey was sent out to the committee. 16 people responded. 7 responded that they attend at least one or more Safe zone training. 7 responded that had done no trainings. 5 responded that had done Implicit Bias trainings. 2 responded that had done the DEI Climate Training. Some responded that had been involved in other trainings not listed. Jennifer went over the results of the Survey for who was extremely comfortable, somewhat comfortable and Not familiar or able to talk about certain topics. This information gives us sense of where our knowledge base might already be and where we might need to get more information. A question was asked on the survey about other topics that we'd like to know more about to prepare for deeper conversation with each other about diversity, equity and inclusion. Results indicated that we would: Like to develop a shared language and basic understanding of the way that we can have these conversations. Appreciate a refresher on key topics that may come up in these conversations. 	 ARC Subcommittees will review the 7 goals and identify what if any they are prepared to begin to work on. Updated EYES Survey Data	 EYES Engagement survey results: Recently, just over 300 students completed the Early Year Engagement Survey (EYES) sent out by the Institutional Research Office for students enrolled during fall term. There are two infographics covering what we have learned through the provided responses: (1) the fall 2020 EYES results, and (2) the comparison between the current fall term results and this past spring term results. Results look very similar to the spring. Higher percentage of students saying CCC was helpful. Higher percentage of students with access to their courses this term. SEM Plan Overview & KEI's	 Tara joined ARC to share the SEM Report and planned PowerPoint that she will be sharing with the larger CCC community in winter term. She asked the ARC members to provide feedback on the following: Does the power point resonate? What is missing from the Power Point? Does that activity make sense? Questions after the PowerPoint: Is this the first time that CCC has had this kind of plan? Yes, to Tara's knowledge after being at CCC for the last 16 years, this is first time that the college has developed a SEM report. Are the goals for increasing enrollment and DEI being set across strategic plans? We want to make sure that all the goals are the same not competing. Answer: Yes, these goals will be set in conjunction with other goals being established in other plans. We have another group that's working on where DEI outcomes strategic enrollment outcomes and Strategic Planning outcomes. We want to make sure that all the goals are the same not competing. Is there a way to track how many Part Time students are converting to Full Time Students? Answer: Good idea. That it is not currently in the report but it might apart of strategy or tactic in our specific goals. Did we identify what the increase could be and what the capacity is? We are trying to be very strategic to say what the right size for our institution should be. What is most import it's not just not about enrollment it is about retaining our students as well.
