CTE Showcase – Written Brief submitted by Shalee Hodgson	What would the outcome look like?           2022 CTE Showcase – Oregon City Campus           The Clackamas Community College CTE Showcase is an event that is planned annually. The first showcase was in August of 2019. Due to COVID-19 the event was not held in 2020 or 2021. The original idea for the showcase was to increase high school student enrollment in CCC CTE programs. In addition to high school students, the event was opened to adults and employers. In 2022 the event was held in person in the Holden Industrial Technology Center and the Automotive lab spaces.           The planning for the 2022 CTE Showcase was led by Tom Brown in partnership with Lori Hall, Sara Dier, Carrie Kraten, Deby McDowell, and Teri Olsen. Tom is a CCC Workforce Advisor who supports students in the Industrial Technology and Automotive Education Focus Area as well as several workforce development programs. College Relations and Marketing supported the event with marketing, artwork for the program, flyers, website, swag, and Eventbrite registration set up. Lori Hall also secured CCC tuition waivers for 100 students attending the event. The CCC Foundation worked with Benchmade Knives to provide a \$500 drawing for one of the students attending. The CCC Foundation Scholarship deadline was also extended after the showcase to provide current and potential students more time to apply.
