Student Handbook – Changes and Content Updates Michelle Baker - 15 minutes	 Michelle Baker joined ARC to give an update on the revisions to the Student Handbook and discuss timelines for content updates. Shared the webpage www.clackamas.edu/student-handbook Created links within the Handbook that directed students to the correct websites that they were looking for rather than having to update the Student handbook every year. The Student handbook was brought to ARC to help look at the timeline as to when we are looking at it each year so that there is no conflict with others.
