<p>Review of Eyes Survey Data</p> <p>Ashley Sears – 30 minutes</p>	<p>The results of the Fall 2022 Student Engagement Survey (EYES) are available. <i>(Click the link then look to the bottom right of the screen for the PDF report that contains the results.)</i></p> <p>The purpose of the survey is to assess student engagement related to student services and to understand student perspectives regarding their college experience at CCC. The results of this survey are used by student services, academic programs, grant reporting, and college administration.</p> <p>Topics include: Education & Career Planning, Advising, Co-Enrollment, Course Preferences (modality and day/time), Campus Connection (belonging), Challenges Experiences (barriers), Work Outside of College, Parent / Guardian Status, Online Learning & Digital Access, Textbooks, and Future Plans and Comments.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overview of EYES Results – Ashley Sears <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Respondents <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Survey distributed to nearly 4,500 students via email. ▪ Overall response rate of 16%. ○ Modality Preferences <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Preference for in-person courses is increasing. ▪ Parent/Guardians are more likely to prefer online classes. ▪ First generation students are more likely to prefer online and evening classes. 	
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- Students working greater than 30 hours a week are more likely to prefer online and evening classes.
- Co-enrollment
 - 76% of students had not heard of co-enrollment.
 - First generation students of color were the least likely to have heard of co-enrollment.
 - First generation white students were more likely to have heard of co-enrollment over a student of color who is not first generation.
- Barriers
 - All financial barriers have gone up.
 - 42% of students say work outside of college is a barrier.
- Work Outside of College
 - Majority of students do not work fulltime.
 - First generation students are working more hours per week on average.
- Technology Resources
 - Very few students know about or know how to use many technology resources such as Start Lab or Northern Digital Literacy.
 - Moving forward, we have campaigns focused on programs like Northern Digital Literacy spreading more awareness about such resources.
- Belonging
 - Some of the time, negative ratings were more likely associated with students of color, first generation students, male students, and students who are working more hours or more days per week.
 - Students with negative responses were more likely to be endorsing more barriers.
 - Students with negative responses tended to desire more collaboration opportunities and more course check-ins.
 - Positive ratings were not more or less likely to be students of color.
 - Students who gave positive ratings were more likely to be entirely online.

<p>SEM Tactic Updates</p> <p>SEM Tactic Leads</p>	<p>Tactic: Increase leveraged funds and SNAP reimbursement. Tactic Lead: Joan Jagodnik Status: On track! # of participants in SNAP is well over halfway to goal (without it being halfway through the grant year), and SNAP has made major strides in integrating the work of SNAP with other programs on campus.</p> <p>Tactic: Develop comprehensive data and research informed student recruitment strategies. Tactic Lead: Paul Allen Status: On track through process. Not everything has been started, but the scope of this tactic (moving towards a Customer Relationship Management tool) requires a lot of planning.</p> <p>Tactic: Provide CCC employees with understanding of where to find resources. Tactic Lead: John Ginsburg (ARC FRS Subcommittee) Status: A little behind, off track by about a week. Work has gone into developing interactive activities and educational scavenger hunts to help employees learn where to go for relevant information.</p> <p>Tactic: Implement Navigate referrals and alerts. Tactic Lead: Dustin Bare. Status: Navigate referrals are already online, further work involves monitoring and assessing areas that need more work or implementation. <p>Financial Resources and Supports Subcommittee</p>	<p>In January, the ARC FRS subcommittee spent most of its time working on the project charter for the SEM Tactic 2.2.1 (Provide CCC employees with an understanding of where to find student financial resources). We have 2 goals to accomplish with this project. One is the development of an online scavenger hunt which helps to demonstrate how to search for such resource information (not just memorizing what it is). The other is a passport activity that is more on-the-ground to familiarize employees with the offices themselves and the people who work in them.
