

Articulation Agreement and Transfer Guide, 2007-2008

Letter of Agreement between The Art Institute of Portland and Clackamas Community College: An Articulation Project for 2007-2008 Academic Year.

This Letter of Agreement has been enacted to facilitate the transfer of credits for students transferring from Clackamas Community College to The Art Institute of Portland. This agreement and transfer guide will be reviewed and updated at the beginning of each academic year by The Art Institute of Portland. This agreement replaces previous articulation agreements between Clackamas Community College and The Art Institute of Portland. Any changes to this agreement shall be made in writing.

I. Institutional Representatives

The following institutional representatives are responsible for implementing the provisions and procedures of this agreement as well as maintaining liaison between the academic advisors at Clackamas Community College and the Transfer Credit Coordinator at The Art Institute of Portland.

II. Residency Requirements

A minimum of 45 credits must be taken at The Art Institute of Portland as a degree-seeking student. Students must also take 24 of their 45 residency credits from upper division major course offerings. 60 quarter credits from Clackamas Community College may be applied towards The Art Institute of Portland's Associate of Arts Degree; 90 quarter credits from Clackamas Community College may be applied towards The Art Institute of Portland's Bachelor Degrees.

All earned credits, with a grade equivalent of “C” or better, are evaluated on a course-by-course basis.

III. Transfer Admission Requirements and Procedure

Students who want to have credit transferred to The Art Institute of Portland must first be admitted to the college. Students must submit an Application for Admission and an Enrollment Agreement with a \$50 application fee. A \$100 tuition deposit is also required and is due within 10 days after the Enrollment Agreement is signed. Students need to submit an official high school transcript (indicating date of graduation) or official GED scores. All official transcripts of post-secondary work, including an official transcript from Clackamas Community College must be submitted, as well as an essay on how an Art Institute education will help achieve career objectives.

IV. Future Agreements

This transfer agreement will be reviewed and revised on an annual basis after catalogs have been published by both Clackamas Community College and The Art Institute of Portland for the upcoming academic year.

V. Articulated Courses

The following courses will transfer to The Art Institute of Portland when the transfer student: earned the course credit during the 2007-2008 academic year; earned a grade of “C” or better in the course; and transferred to The Art Institute of Portland within five years of earning the course credit.
