The students will demonstrate the ability to prepare for the assignment, define the preparation and mobilization for the fire crew, travel and arrive at the assignment, address safety and risk management principle prior to engaging the crew in an operation, define key firefighting tactics, describe the the crew boss duties when the crew is in base camp and prepare the crew for demobilization/release after completing the assignment.
