EMS was called and the patient was taken to a medical facility. • A student was taken to the campus safety office after experiencing 5 seizures. EMS was called, and they were transferred to a hospital. • A student experienced low blood sugar, then high blood sugar, and was very light headed. They slumped against a wall then laid down. An employee called College Safety and EMS. EMS arrived and took the student for medical attention. • College safety received a report of a student passed out in McLoughlin. When the officer arrived, the student was coherent and talking on the phone. The student appeared fine and returned to class.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A student was meeting with DRC staff, and it was noticed that the student was experiencing several myoclonic seizures. 911 was called and College Safety notified. It was decided not to transport the student to the hospital. Instead, the student's brother took her home. • A student cut their finger with a hand pruner. It was not noted if they sought medical treatment. • A student slipped on a puddle of water in front of a urinal. The student had noticed a few weeks earlier that every time the urinal is flushed, water sprays onto the floor. He reported this issue to a custodian. On this particular day, he slipped and fell into the pooled water, hitting his hand and causing bruising and swelling to his knuckles and hand. He did not seek medical attention, however he reports this to College Safety. College Safety informed him that they would put caution tape and submit a repair work order. • A student put potatoes in hot butter and it splashed and burned their arm. • While working in the Food Pantry in Wacheno, a shelf broke and a frozen bag of egg yolks fell on this student's right knee. No medical attention was needed. • During a wrestling match, a visiting wrestler took a hard hit and did not get up from the mat. EMS was called.
