Sexual Harassment Prevention Training	 BJ Rinearson reporting: College Council, Presidents' Council and all associations have been given opportunity to give input in regard to Sexual Harassment Prevention Training online. This is a recommended not mandatory training. Changes have been made as suggested and are still gathering final feedback information. Faculty Senate is going through the training now. The only information being tracked through this training is who did or did not complete the training. Possible January/February implementation Next Steps: Advisory Committee will determine committee run roll-out strategies and promotions processes Advisory committee will review and discuss in the future the feasibility of mandatory trainings
SEM	Joanne introduced Connie Green and thanked her for her assistance as a consultant to the taskforce working on the SEM project and the Clackamas Community College Climate Survey. Bill Zuelke distributed and explained the CCC SEM Taskforce, Final Report to the College Community [handout #1: a complete representation of the body of work by the SEM Taskforce can be found at http://www2.clackamas.edu/sem/documents/SEMImplementationPlan.pdf] and the final implementation plan that outlines related processes to the model strategic enrollment management plan and its many components. • We are at phase three of this project with one last phase to go. • AACRAO conducted an evaluation and determined CCC is very good at tactics and strategies and quite clear about our mission and goals but our enrollment infrastructure and data gathering capacity and management was weak. • AACRAO made 21 recommendations for improvement on all levels of the pyramid outlined. These have been broken down into 3 categories that are outlined on handout #1 with details found on the detailed implementation plan. • Key initiatives to move forward on and make happen • Priorities already begun and need to keep doing • Priorities already completed and need to make sure they stay that way • Our Charge: Develop a three year SEM implementation plan based on recommendations from the AACRAO consulting final report that is in alignment with institutional mission. Connie Green as a facilitator shared her observation:

	 The categories are broken down in a way that makes sense. We must look at on-going committees. We must keep in mind that even if there are no resources and there are budget cuts, someone still needs to own Strategic Enrollment Management.
	 Next Steps: SEM Task Force recommendations presented today will also be presented at College Council on November 21 and the Board on December 10. We need to identify the SEM Committee/Council; the current SEM Task Force needs to provide Joanne Truesdell with recommendations as to how this committee/council needs to be configured and/or connected. It is hoped that the SEM Task Force will be celebrating the completion of their work in December and would then pass on the binders to the SEM Committee (which will hopefully be established as the ongoing tool for Strategic Enrollment Management).
	 These recommendations will be taken through the regular budget process. They may end up being a top priority or they may not. The purpose of the findings and recommendations of the SEM Task Force is to help create the possibility of good decision making around financial resources.

Climate Survey Update	Connie Green discussed highlights [handout #2] of the Clackamas Community College Organizational Climate Survey 2008. • The format followed for the 2008 survey is similar to that used in 2006 (January 2006 final report to the Board). We may want to consider changing the format in the future. • A report on findings and recommendations was created as a starting place for discussions. • The purpose today was to obtain input as to how best to prepare the report for the Clackamas Community and College Board of Education. Connie Green asked for comments and discussion points: • Response level; it was low in comparison to last time • 2006 Survey: 60% responded • 2008 Survey: 30% responded • The tone of answers was very different this time as we are now working under very different conditions. • Association leaders were asked if their members had the opportunity to participate. Each association also sent communications and links to the survey. The IT Help Desk received very few technical assistance questions
