Faculty Replacement Position – Nursing and Allied Health Division	 Elizabeth Lundy requested permission to fill the existing position of Full-Time Faculty Nursing and Allied Health Division. Some of the job responsibilities include overview of the CNA-I (long term care focus) plus CNA-II (acute care track), recently approved by the State Board of Nursing; approximately 80 students per term; 12 credit programs heavily reliant on part-time faculty; supervisor/coordinator of many part time staff; and submission of reports to the State Board. Presidents' Council approved the position of, Full-Time Faculty – Nursing and Allied Health Division, to be moved forward.
