Good afternoon,

As cases of COVID-19 continue to surge across the state, Gov. Brown announced last week a two-week freeze starting Wednesday, Nov. 18, and ending Dec. 2.

Some of the freezes include:

- Limiting social get-togethers to no more than six people
- Limiting restaurants and bars to take-out and delivery only
- Closing gyms and fitness organizations
- Limiting grocery stores and retail stores to 75% capacity

What does this mean for Clackamas Community College? There are no direct impacts to colleges in the governor's two-week freeze. Classes being held in person will continue as scheduled, and all other online classes and virtual student services will continue. Athletics is currently on hold for two weeks due to a confirmed COVID-19 case.
