It was agreed upon by the Oversight Group that this is a discussion for the Oversight Group and should be added to the Retreat in January to make sure all unassigned/unaligned Committees have a Council.

<u>Finance Council</u> – Held their Retreat and submitted Council Priorities. Budget Advisory Subcommittee (BAS) is meeting and will hold more meetings than the Finance Council because there will be a more intensive process than what was originally planned for.
