When you go through the process of entering your event online through 25Live, you will now come to a third, new page titled “Publish to Calendar Request.” This page will give you the option to check one of the following two boxes or to leave them blank.</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Featured Event Request (event open to public and publicized/ promoted through media).</i> - <i>Display as a non-featured public event on the CCC website.</i> <p><i>Featured events will be subject to review/approval by Public Affairs. Comprehensive Internationalization Plan Presenter: Ida Flippo	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>During 2013-14, CCC will be involved with a self-study that assists colleges in determining how internationalized their campuses are and their readiness to work with international students. This term-long self-study will be conducted by Ida Flippo, along with identified team members, as supported by a mini grant and the Academic Foundations and Connections (AFAC) division. The study is using a tool provided by the Community Colleges for International Development, Inc. This may include individuals already assisting with international students (Enrollment, Advising, ESL/PIE) and the International Education Committee. Once an identified team is established, they will review CCC’s current level of internationalization in several areas. A gap analysis will be performed and then an executive summary will be produced. Based upon research into best practices, recommendations will be made as to which areas would benefit from a greater emphasis on internationalization, and how best to go about implementing changes. By the end of fall term, the team plans to have the study complete and report back to College Council. Once gaps are identified, the team will develop recommendations for CCC.</i>
