Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) (Engagement = Retention & Success) Presenter: BJ Nicoletti	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>One of the survey tools that CCC uses to assess “student engagement” is the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) which is conducted every three years. This spring term we will have administered this survey for the third time. Many student insights will be gained from conducting this study. There are five main “benchmark areas” to pay special attention to: active and collaborative learning; student effort; academic challenge; student-faculty interaction; support for learners. CCSSE will be administered at the end of April/beginning of May. Roughly 75-80 randomly selected credit classes will participate. Faculty will be informed in advance that their students will need approximately 35-40 minutes to complete.</i></li> </ul>
