Approval of Minutes - 6/6/2014 and 10/3/2014 Presenter: Phillip King	Both sets of minutes from College Council Meetings held on June 6, 2014 and October 3, 2014 were presented. <i>Minutes were accepted</i> .
Bond Update Presenter: Bob Cochran	 There are 500 Clackamas County voter pamphlets out in Bob's area in Lewelling. If you don't live in Clackamas County and would like to see what the CCC bond information looks like in the pamphlet, please come by and get one. Bob updated the group with some great information on how the bond process is going: Staff has been tracking bond efforts since March 2014. It is estimated that 318 volunteers (friends, staff and board members) have attended 113 events (the goal was 100 events in the summer and early fall) and by numerous electronic and paper communications plus many other efforts, made over 600,000 connections to get the word out about the bond. The Friends of CCC have had 400 volunteers that have phoned 13,000 people, knocked on 3,000 doors, and signed 42,000 postcards. 26 large signs have been placed throughout the district encouraging a yes vote. The Oregon City Campus has a voter drop box. There are 19 more days to go before the vote. If you are interested in canvassing, meet at the Bomber from 11-2 each remaining Saturday. If you would like to volunteer for the phone banks, they will be held on October 27, 28, 30 and November 3 & 4. Contact your associations if you are interested. ARCC Update Presenter: Phillip King	 The Access, Retention and Completion Committee (ARCC) has emerged from the old SEM (Strategic Enrollment Management) Committee. The timing was not as smooth as it could have been. Bruce expressed concern regarding the new key policy. Instructors are used to getting into buildings before the buildings are open. Fulltime faculty wants to make sure that the college is ensuring quality when working with dual credit classes and the high schools. The fulltime faculty is hopeful that the FT to PT ratio will be dealt with. Who wrote the new edition of the College Council Mission Statement? Why was it not a group who wrote it? President Truesdell wanted the mission statement to match what was in our Visions to Reality document. The mission statement is not a final version. Any comments or suggestions, let Phillip know Another question asked was is College Council considered to have authority or oversight over committees on campus? They committees should follow the decision making flow chart. If the relationships between committees has changed to a new process, why was it changed and how was that decision made? There is a concern that decisions being made for the college as a whole are not including everyone.
