#### Approval of Minutes (11/21/14) - Phillip King

Minutes were sent out a week ago. Mary Collins moved to accept the minutes from the November 21, 2014 College Council Meeting. Steffen Moller seconded. Minutes approved.

Phillip King announced that the fun and fit wellness lunch is being held right now in the Fireside Room. There is plenty of good food so please go and get some lunch.

#### Logo Survey Results/Brand Development – Shelly Parini, Janet Paulson and Jay Clemens

**Shelly Parini**: Asked the group if they have taken the survey. In preparation for CCC's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2016, a new brand for the college is being looked at. Last time it was changed was in 1988. This has been built into the strategic priorities. The Steering Committee was Rob Campbell, Melissa, Dustin Bare and Janet Paulson. Turtledove Clemens was hired as we go through this process.

Janet Paulson: We have been working with Turtledove Clemens since March 2014. The investigation was exhaustive. She learned things about the campus she never knew. There is a history of work with the Clackamas community. The Marketing Advisory Panel was open to everyone. 325 people were on the marketing advisory panel: 60% were students. There were 2 surveys in spring that included logo types, key words, mascots, and colors. Initially they looked at thousands of logos, fonts and mascots. New logo and colors will be presented to the Board next week. Thank you to all who took part in it.

**Jay Clemens:** This was a wonderful process. He now knows a lot of people at CCC. Where we started from.... took existing icon and thought what can we do to incorporate the legacy? Take what was there and move it forward. For the icon they took it to 3 to represent the 3 campuses and 3 C's. Tried to take the original and make it more contemporary. Next one, was to incorporate the 3 C's. Having both upper and lower case font is friendlier. Results were shown. #4 was the leader from the survey.



They had 2700 themes to start. So they went back to look at Imagine Clackamas. Value can mean very affordable or something that is of great worth. We want the students to feel welcomed and supported. Value Education Training Support was one of the choices.

At the upcoming Board meeting they will not be recommending a theme or mascot but will only be showing the logo and font. The colors of scarlet & navy have already been presented to the Board. There were a dozen mascots looked at and then narrowed down to 3. The 2 that got the most votes were the cougar with steely eyes and the one that had CCC in the cougar head. Since these two got the most votes and were so close, we are going to have a mascot smackdown. Students will be involved to decide the mascot and logo. These are not the finished products but helping to giving direction on what people like. 1600 took part in the final survey. There will be a similar survey for the foundation to see how closely the foundation wants to link to this.

#### **Committee Reports**

1. **Presidents' Council:** The key policy that was presented here at College Council went forward to Presidents' Council and was approved. This is a substantial change to the college. Also asked was when does it officially start? And who tells everyone about it? Phillip will bring these questions to President's Council.

The Secretary of State audit visit was this past Monday. There were 3 auditors. The college felt that the visit went well.

There was a textbook affordability survey that went out to our students. It was posted for two days. It was not a CCC survey.

The new late registration policy was approved. There was a conversation about communication of the new policy so students and staff are ready.

The book exchange is starting this week. Students can put books up for sale. In the first two weeks of winter term they can check to see if their books sold. Students put their own price on the books. Another way ASG is helping out.

**Johnney Russ – Vice President of ASG:** They will have a logo smackdown. This will include surveys with pictures of logos. They will be handed out to students at events.

ASG has an outstanding team this year. There are 15 new members.
