ISP 471 Courses that may be repeated for additional credit towards degree completion

PURPOSE

Defines the conditions which allow a student to repeat a course for additional credit towards degree completion.

SUMMARY

Students may repeat a course as often as they wish. However, only in certain circumstances may credits from a repeated course be applied towards degree completion.

STANDARD

- 1. Certain classes may be repeated for additional credit towards degree completion as specified in the catalog. If a catalog course description does not include information that specifies the course may be repeated and credits applied, then credits from repeating the course may not be applied towards degree completion.
- 2. Variable credit courses may be repeated and credits applied to degree completion only up to the number of credits allowed for the class.
- 3. Courses that may be repeated for additional credit towards degree completion are non-challengeable.
- 4. CWE courses may be repeated and credits applied. Specific procedures, limitations, and conditions are specified in the "Cooperative Work Experience" standard in this manual.
