

Embedded Online Information Literacy Instructional Initiative - Overview

Using an embedded model that promotes the flipped classroom, CCC Library will deliver relevant information literacy instruction to students at their points of need and within the context of WR121 and WR122. Instruction will be delivered over several weeks via Moodle in the form of interactive tutorials, videos, and formative assessments created by librarians. Subsequent WR121 and WR122 face-to-face library instruction sessions will focus on hands-on, active learning work time.

Tutorials

Interactive tutorials will teach information literacy content related to CCC Library resources and services, searching strategies, information evaluation, and citing sources. Tutorials will be ADA compliant, deviceagnostic, and accessible to students and faculty anytime, anywhere. Tutorial content and activities will tie directly to course learning outcomes and assignments, to the information literacy-related Transferable General Education Course Outcomes in Oregon, and to the information literacy threshold concepts included in the ACRL's Framework for Information Literacy for Higher Education (2015).

Assessments

This model of instruction will allow for reliable assessment of student learning related to information literacy. Built-in activities and no/low-stakes formative assessments will check student learning in each module. WR121 and WR122 assignments and rubrics will be revised (if needed) to clearly assess student learning related to information literacy outcomes. Librarians will have access to assessment data so as to continually improve instructional content.
