Format changes were made to help clarify the intent of the language. College employees are mandatory reporters, so you must report an alleged act of sexual harassment, discrimination or assault. By re-evaluating, developing, and implementing a clearer and consistent admissions process, CCC will be able to gather crucial data at the front door. By better understanding who our students are and what they are doing here, the services the College provides will not only be measurably improved, but will foster <u>earlier</u> connections between the student and CCC beyond an email or application. The team is looking for a new name for SISTERRS. Please forward your ideas for consideration.

It states that the Clackamas email is the official email that the college uses to communicate with students. Typically, procedures are not brought to College Council, but this one will be brought back to review email expectations. Expect to see the two separate procedures in the fall - one for staff and another for students. ARC 601 Expressive Conduct Policy – Suggestions were brought forward and added from the last College Council. Joanne suggested that with the recent changes that our legal counsel review this policy.

Note that miniature horses will remain in the policy due to the fact that we accept federal funds. Concerns were brought up regarding conflicting disabilities for students as well as faculty.
