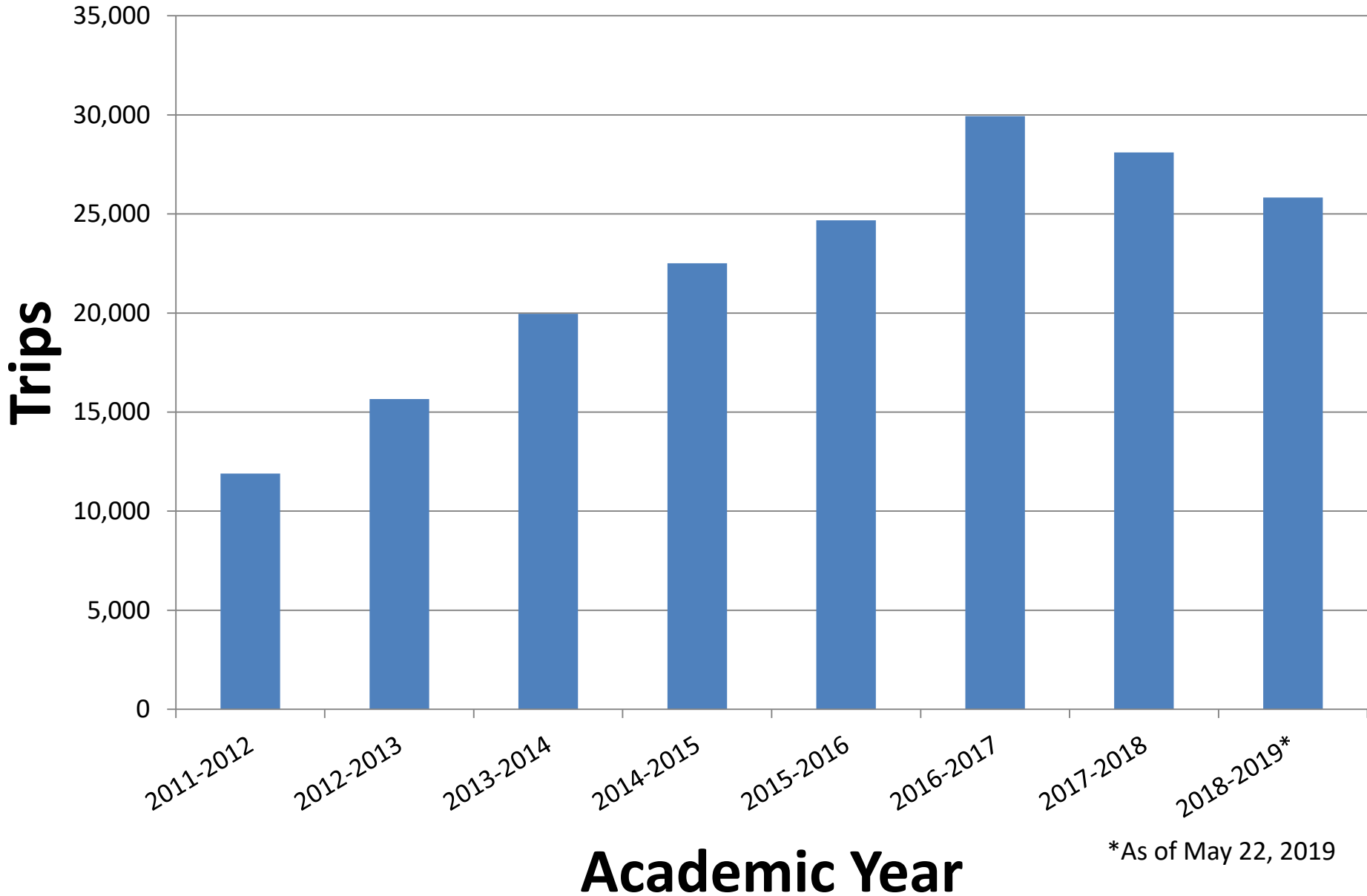
Highlights



- Ray started at CCC in June 2018
- Awarded \$273,083 grant from Oregon DOT
 - Summer term shuttle service and year-round expanded evening service
- Awarded \$150,000 grant from Oregon Metro
 - Ray’s position and transportation programs
- TriMet transition from paper passes to Hop Cards
 - Transition from Bookstore to Enrollment Services
 - TriMet’s Low-Income Fare Program
- Installed 1st wheelchair charging station
- Opened new transit center

2018 Average Response: 4.4

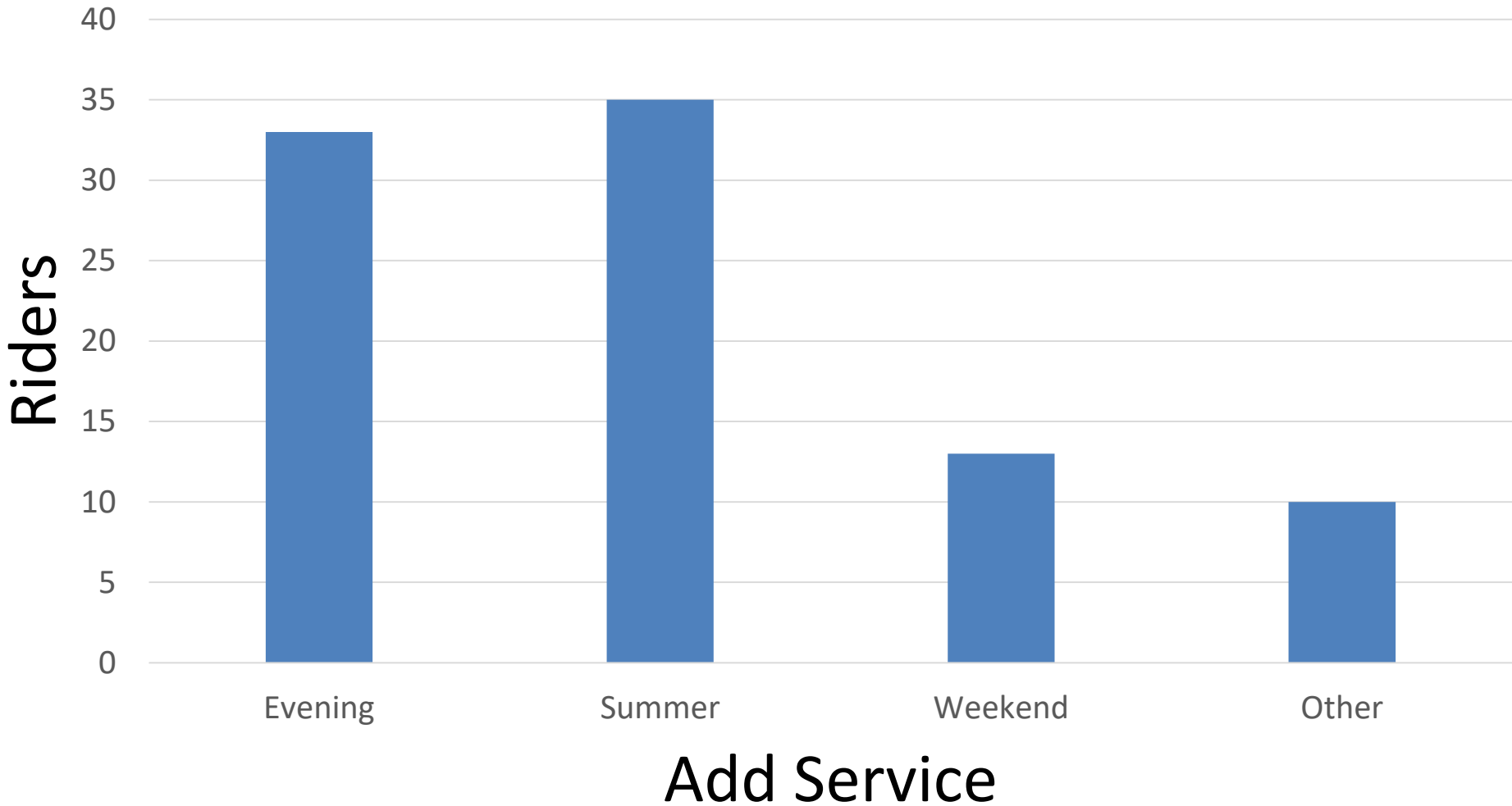
3. How safely do the drivers operate? (5= Very Safe)

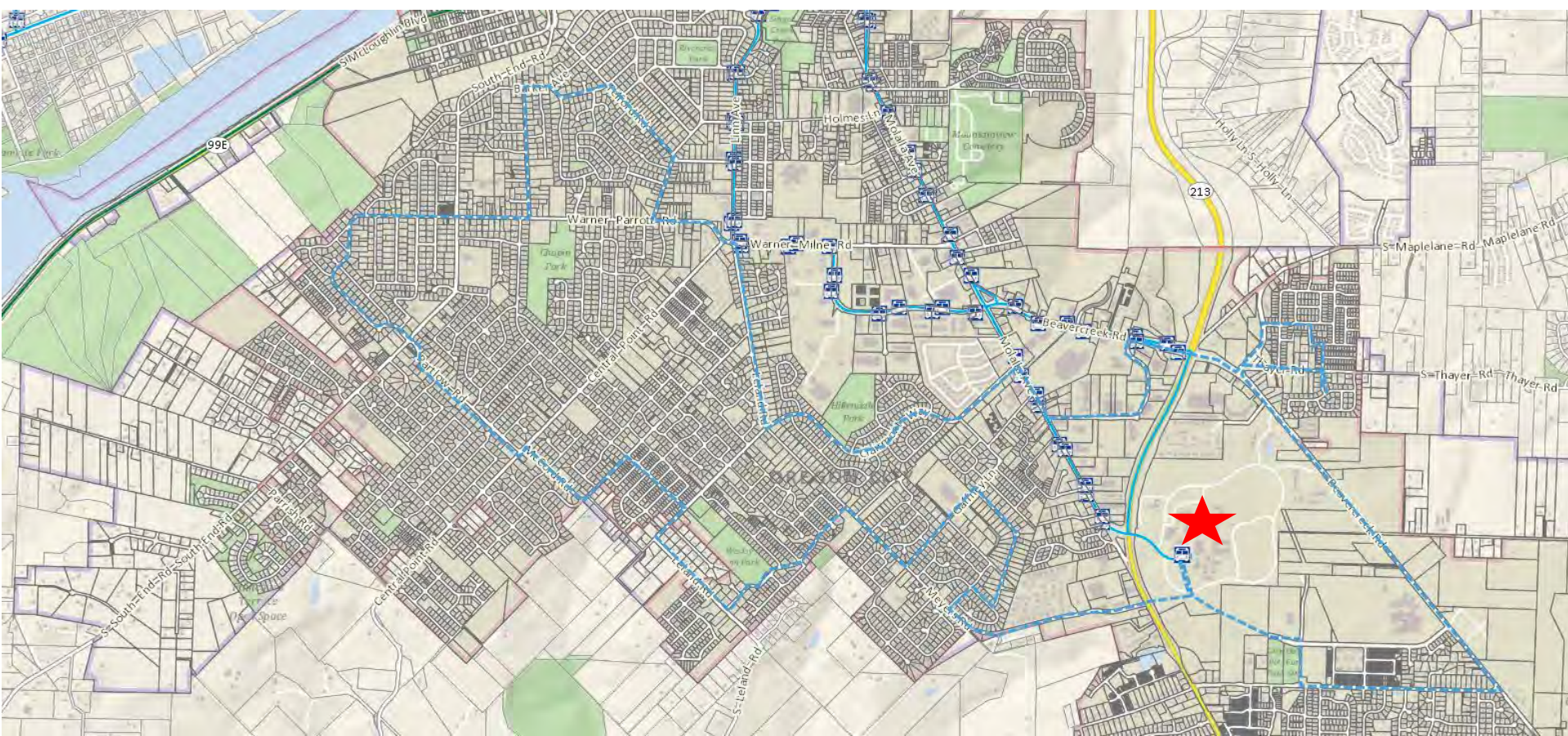

Introducing TriMet's reduced fare for low-income riders



- \$28 for month pass (normal cost is \$100)
- Who qualifies?
 - Adult (18-64 years old)
 - Seniors, Medicare, disability, youth qualify for other pass
 - Oregon resident
 - Earn up to 200% of federal poverty level. Under current federal poverty level, this would be \$24,276 for individual and \$50,196 for a family of 4.
