PURPOSE

Establishes regulation and conditions for awarding college credit through the College Level Examination Program (CLEP)

SUMMARY

Clackamas Community College awards CLEP credit to students who have completed a College Board College-Level Examination in a recognized subject area and in accordance with the following conditions.

STANDARD

- CLEP credit will be awarded according to the American Council on Education (ACE) recommendations.
- Course equivalency will be determined by the department. Instructional
 departments will determine the appropriate course equivalency for CLEP
 students. (See ISP 373A College Level Examination Program Credit Chart)
- CLEP credit will be noted on the student transcript and may be applied towards course equivalencies, program requirements and degree completion.



The Clackamas Regional Skills Competition is a bridge between high school and college which provides students an opportunity to demonstrate skills and knowledge in academic competitions and events and to also engage in college exposure opportunities.

The aim of the event is to promote a college-going culture, expose students to a college campus, and increase the likelihood of attendance.

Event Outcomes

Short-term/day-of

- There is a variety of academic and college exposure activities for students to participate meaningfully in the event.

- vii. Transportation options are available and clear for students and high schools.

Event Outcomes

Long-term

- i. 40% of winners use tuition waivers.
- ii. Career Fair vendors and CCC business partners are better connected with competitions.
- iii. X% of Clackamas County students participate in the event.
- iv. The Steering Committee connects participation and winner data to national/state/local student success data.
