Reasons unit planning is AWESOME


- Asks groups to reflect on how their work relates to the strategic plan
- Creates space for groups to name areas of focus
- Invites groups to request resources that will help them do more/better/other

Things that are true

- Unlikely to have a bunch (if any) money to put behind budget requests
- Assessment timelines are a bit later this year—won't be available at the outset of BAG process
- Unit planning timeline used in years past has been funky—asks groups to forecast 10-22 months into the future

Reasons unit planning is AWESOME

- Asks groups to reflect on how their work relates to the strategic plan?
- Creates space for groups to name areas of focus
- Invites groups to request resources that will help them do more/better/other



What about!?!?!?!

- POR (Faculty Position Opening Request)
 - Group met Thursday, 10/15 for a first meeting to talk process for this year
- Dire needs ("My lab is on fire")
 - Jason working with the Deans to come up with a simple-as-possible process to make those needs known
 - Will require some creative resourcing

- Folks involved in CQI efforts are getting together over the course of this year to think about what longer-term changes we might propose, to streamline/improve these processes (academic assessment, service-area assessment, program review, unit planning)
