Faculty Changes for Grading, Rosters, etc.	Chris Sweet	 With WebAdvisor/CougarTrax going away, grading, rosters and other faculty actions will be done in Self Service. Preview for faculty as grading will look like. College is in the process of implementing a new portal. Along with that we need to retire WebAdvisor/CougarTrax – how faculty submit grades. It is very, very old technology and is not going to be supported by Ellucian much longer. There's a new tool, Self Service. All faculty will have to move to Self Service. Currently working with a small pilot of faculty to test in winter term. Spring term all staff and faculty will have access to old and new portals. Then in summer term 2021, the old system goes away and everyone will have to use the new system. Not much different, just looks more modern. Trainings will be held in spring term. Please extend an invitation to Chris to attend any meeting to present. Chris shared his screen and showed the group the faculty view of self-service. Showed how to do grading – what it looks like. System will be verifying grades every night right after 12:05am. Once verified, grades show to student. Q: Will there be training opportunities for students to use this system? A: Real students but in test environment. Will be using/teaching the system in the FYE 101 classes as well.

		Showed what has been installed up to date. Moving away from parking lots associated with buildings. Campus maps are located at quad and access points. There are rules and regulations signs.
		In process now are the vehicular kiosks. Pull outs at the main entry and by Clairmont. The one by Clairmont has been formalized with curbs so vehicles can pull out of traffic to view map. Height is about 11 feet. Will also place lighting on the top of the pole. Shows a service guide of the most accessed services and campus map.
College Entries Monument Redesign and Site Signage Updates		Trying to standardize signs around campus. With this signage system all graphics are vinyl applied. They are easy to change/update.
		We now have 3 entrances onto campus. 3 monument signs are in design right now. Should be up by the end of June. Banners will be sunsetted. The monument signs are made of anodized aluminum which has little to no rust. These signs also accept the vinyl graphics easily. This helps with easy updating. Hoping to integrate backlighting on text and our logo.
		Q: Is the new Welcome Center on the key? A: Not yet. We will update when it is open.
	C: Sign updates: Home Orchard Education Center (HOEC), Student Organic Farm and why is there not a phone number on the sign?	

C: Good catch. What number would we associate with it? Phone tree? Campus Safety number? Web address instead of a phone number? Include Campus Safety in an emergency. Students say we know how to Google.
Q: Is the Welcome Center listed to the left? I did not see it.
Q: Would similar signs also be put at Harmony and Wilsonville? A: As resources are available, will roll this forward to Harmony Campus.
C: Very nice!
C: Great work Bob and team!
C: This looks great and attracts the eye.
Q: Will the Clairmont sign be put in the same place as the banner? A: That's where it's currently planned to be placed. Barring any complications, that is the best placement. C: Plant ID specimens are there.
C: There is a plan to widen the road on Beavercreek. Is there a way to get that info ahead of time? On the Oregon City website: https://www.orcity.org/publicworks/beavercreek-road-concept-plan
C: The colorful parking lots stand out so nicely on these signs. In a future iteration, you might consider giving the pedestrian signage a similar distinguishing characteristic to tell buildings from each other (rather than all gray with small reference letters and lists). C: Great idea but only so many colors to distinguish between.
Q: Is placement for the big signs done in a way that allows small cars to see traffic and students as they enter/leave the college? A: They have accommodated that.
Q: At one point we were talking about reader boards at the entrance(s). Is there any update on that? A: Reader Boards will be on the brick marquees.

Q: How are the reader boards going to be maintained? A: Adding to ticketing system.
Q: Should we refer folks that need help to the welcome center? A: depends on the help.
C: I think having a quick public safety phone number for those who jog, bike around would be helpful.
Q: Is the "You are here" going to be red on the finished sign? I have students to whom there is no "red" color. This comment does come up. A: The text does reinforce that. International symbols are used. C: White on red. White doesn't show up well. Neither does the little star referencing that. Red is not there. C: A black outline on each letter helps. Textures are also good. Any way we can emphasize that. Outline letters under services also.
Q: Can the boards have separate messages? A: At each entrance, yes.
C: Reader board is so great for all of our events on campus and community visibility. Thanks for that!
C: A great way to announce our student performances for music, theater, etc. That helps us promote how we serve our students and our community with these programs!
Q: Is there a signal light planned at Clairmont and Beavercreek? A: One was put in last bond. Q: What about a signal light at the road by the Rainbow Building?
Don't have the Welcome Center listed on the new sign as we don't exactly know when the new building will open. Q: Could we have it illustrated on the map but not show services? A: The map is already in production. We know there are going to be edits to make following installation. Want the dust to settle with all of the moves before making final.
Q: Will the road next to observatory be opened? A: We will look into it.
