Subcommittee purpose

- Identify and address barriers to student retention and completion using institutional data
- Develop short-term solutions and projects to address retention and completion barrier
- Share projects and work with ARC and the CCC community
- Get feedback and additional ideas from wider ARC group as necessary



Past Work

- Conversations on barriers to student retention and completion; using subcommittee's different student experiences to identify areas of need
- Developed 'Important Dates' calendar that was placed in every building on the OC campus to ensure students were aware of deadlines (e.g., scholarships, registration, add/drop, etc.)
- Provided input to IR on the "Leavers Survey" to address term-toterm retention issues
- Reviewed institutional retention and completion data to understand trends



This year

- Developing a webpage designed to gather feedback from the CCC student body and community about their experiences, for the subcommittee to then glean just-in-time and short-term retention and completion issues to address. Year over year, EYES data has shown a need for a centralized, accessible and inclusive way for students to communicate with the College about their experiences outside of the bi-annual EYES survey.
- The webpage also elevates similar communication processes already in place at CCC that are not centralized – CARE referral, campus safety, and the problem resolution process. Additionally, a section labeled "I'm not sure who to contact" has been added in hopes of easing confusion and bouncing students back and forth between service areas

Subcommittee purpose

- Identifying and addressing financial barriers to access, retention and completion; taking action on barriers that we encounter
- Identification, awareness/understanding, and increasing education/distribution of supports for students
- Invite ideas for reducing financial barriers for students

Questions we ask ourselves

- What do we know about challenges students have faced within our systems of support?
- How do we survey the needs/issues across the board that might be barriers to student success?
- How to we move from identifying the problem to finding a solution (frequently complicated w/ many players)?
- What is our authority when we engage with a department that oversees something where barriers might exist?



Past Work

- Discussions on consistency of various funding sources that ultimately come from CCC Foundation (Counseling, Financial Aid, Veterans Services)
- Met with Business Office to discuss students who had small account balances which might be easily covered, and thus enabling them to continue to register.
- Provided input on "How to Pay for College" brochure produced by the Financial Aid department.
