Why Textbook Affordability Matters

Textbook Affordability removes barriers to knowledge access through flexible alternatives to traditional information exchange. **Benefits include:**

- **Students** save money, have perpetual access to course material, and can contribute to the development of course material and curricula.
- Faculty have choice and autonomy in developing course material, can customize ancillaries, can freely share knowledge and information.

Textbook Affordability Workgroup

The Textbook Affordability Workgroup (TAW) was formed in Fall 2019 in response to HB2213 which "Requires each community college and public university to establish textbook affordability plan."

Textbook Affordability Plan

Textbook Affordability Workgroup Goals:

- 1. Make adopting affordable textbooks a priority
- 2. Provide structures to support faculty interested in shifting to free / low-cost texts
- 3. Create roadmap for educating faculty, administration, and students on finding and using these materials
- 4. Set measurable goals that are realistic for two realities current support, and recommended support

Current Support Level in TAP

- Goal 1: Convene Textbook Affordability Workgroup.
- Goal 2: Maintain CCC participation on OER Statewide Steering Committee.
- Goal 3: Library support (PTF librarian 2 hr/week):
 - maintain Textbook Affordability webpage
 - deliver one OER/LCT faculty workshop a year
 - limited support for faculty adoption
- Goal 4: Maintain current level of LCT-designated courses.
- Goal 5: Student education is limited to LCT designation in Course Schedule.



Current Support Level Outcomes

- Percent of courses designated as LCT stays at 19%.
- CCC estimates that each student will pay \$600 in class materials per quarter (<u>CCC Tuition + Fees</u>).

Recommended Support level Goals in TAP

Goal 1: With leadership from our new TA Librarian, the College will seek to adopt systems and structures that promote adoption of affordable textbooks and related materials.

Goal 2: TA Librarian will lead efforts to significantly enhance the level of CCC community wide participation in State and regional TA networks.



Recommended Support level in TAP

Goal 3a: With leadership from our new TA Librarian, the College anticipates a cumulative student savings of \$3.3 million (in five years from hire).

Goal 3b: With leadership from our new TA Librarian, the College anticipates increasing College courses designated as LCT from 19% (current) to 59% (five years from hire).

Recommended Support level in TAP

Goal 4: CCC commits to transparency and continuity in textbook costs for students (i.e., students can plan for affordable courses in advance).

Recommended Support Level Outcomes

In five years from hire:

- Percent of courses designated as LCT cumulatively increases to 59%.
- CCC estimates cumulative student savings of \$3.3 million.
- One degree or certificate comprised of 100% LCT / no-cost courses ("Z-degree") is established.

Adoption Process - What happens next?

- Now week 9. CCC community reviews the <u>Textbook Affordability Plan</u> and shares feedback (http://bit.ly/ta-plan).
 - We ask for 30 minutes of your time to read, reflect, and submit feedback.
- Week 10 TAW meets to make adjustments and clarifications based on feedback.
- Week 11 TAW submits plan to the state.

Definitions / Acronyms

OER - Open Educational Resources: Any copyrightable work that is in the public domain or has an open license that allows everyone (faculty, students, anyone) to retain, revise, remix, reuse, redistribute.

LCT - Low-Cost Textbooks: The low cost designation (<\$40) requirement means many faculty are trying to lower costs.

TAW - Textbook Affordability Workgroup: CCC workgroup tasked with creation of Textbook Affordability Plan

TAP - Textbook Affordability Plan: Mandated by Oregon HB2214, CCC must file a plan for how we will lower costs for students.
