Textbook Affordability Workgroup Update Kerry Leek		Kerry shared a PowerPoint about the workgroup's goals and achievements so far and encouraged all to advocate for affordable textbooks. The workgroup was created in response to HB2213 requiring community colleges and public institutions to establish textbook affordability plan. The draft plan to be submitted to the State is available for feedback through May 28. The workgroup is advocating for a Textbook Affordability Librarian to attain the following goals within five years of hire date: • Percent of courses designated as LCT cumulatively increases to 59%. • CCC estimates cumulative student savings of\$3.3 million. • One degree or certificate comprised of 100% LCT (<\$40) /no-cost courses ("Z-degree") is established. CCC Portal Migration	Lori Hall, Chris Sweet, Dustin Bare, Vicki Hedges & Stephen Wilks	The group provided a demonstration of the new myClackamas portal for students, staff, and faculty. Lori sent an all staff email with a link to the new site. The college will switch over to the new system in June, with an assessment, including feedback opportunities, following fall 2021 term. Reasons for a new system: current portal has been discontinued by vendor; removes reliance on old marketing CMS; easier to integrate with CCC systems, such as Tableau, Rave, 25Live; and to ensure site is mobile friendly. Questions and Comments Q: Can you add links to Navigate and Self Service under Student Resources? A: Student links are at the top of the portal main page. Q: Historically there has been leave balance and pay advice information in the portal for employees. Will the information still be available? A: Some information will remain as functional through the old site/system for now. Part-time faculty will be able to view more information about their assignment contracts, similar to what is on an FAC. Training will be available soon.
Return to Campus	Tara Sprehe	Tara shared a brief update of taskforce's work in preparation for returning more people to campus next academic year. The new recently formed taskforce is a smaller group led by David and Tara. They will organize work around increased return to campus requests. Expertise subgroups will bring recommendations to the taskforce. Taskforce is currently listening to college/community to create a repository of questions and concerns; modifying current application as needed; and communicating updates based on state and local guidance. Look for invitations in May for divisions to meet with the taskforce to document questions and concerns. More information will also be available at upcoming College Council meetings.
