World Trust Training – the Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Committee has scheduled another Roots of Social Justice training for Nov 18. Automotive Service Program Internships – the program facilitated their first placement of interns; 8 out of 9 were placed. Also revised the program recently. Early Childhood Education Program – now offers a Spanish program. Fall term had 69 students registered.
